

B.A. COMMUNICATION STUDIES HEALTH COMMUNICATION CONCENTRATION

Health Communication is a 39 credit hour program designed to examine the role of communication in the understanding, promotion, and maintenance of good health. Emphasis is placed on social construction of health, structural and social determinants of health, patient-provider communication, communication in healthcare organizations, interpersonal and family communication about health, mental health, gender, spirituality, disability, and aging. Students choosing this track are generally interested in careers in the healthcare field, including such positions as patients' advocates, public health information officers, medical office managers, and pharmaceutical sales.
